I wanted to keep you both updated on a follow-up letter to FDOT I sent out today. Last year, the TBEP Policy Board asked that I send a letter to FDOT letting them know of the Old Tampa Bay Integrated Model project and offering to work with them to evaluate various causeway configurations for the Howard Frankland Bridge. Our model is now complete and available, and the attached letter again offers to work with FDOT to examine ways that the water quality may be improved in Old Tampa Bay with the new bridge configurations.

Representative Jolly is also interested in encouraging FDOT to consider using our model, and has asked to be kept informed—I have copied him on this letter also.

Subject: TBEP offer to FDOT re: application of Old Tampa Bay integrated model

Dear Ms. Creighton:

The Tampa Bay Estuary Program (TBEP), in partnership with the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFMWD), has now completed a suite of watershed and bay models to determine possible environmental benefits resulting from future management actions in the lands surrounding Old Tampa Bay. These management actions can range from improvements to stormwater and wastewater infrastructure in the watershed to physical alterations of causeways and bridges that span Old Tampa Bay. Based on the simulated outputs garnered from the integrated models, informed resource management decisions can be

made regarding the cost-effectiveness of future projects to help improve Old Tampa Bay's environmental condition.

Simulated results from the TBEP and SWFWMD modeling effort indicate that localized benefits to circulation (and therefore water quality improvements) in the western nearshore portions of Old Tampa Bay may result from modifications to the Howard Frankland Bridge causeway. These improvements may potentially lead to improvements in seagrass habitat and reductions in nuisance algal blooms in these regions of Old Tampa Bay. The TBEP has committed some future funds to work with regional partners to exercise the models for refined assessments of potential management actions in the region. As such, we encourage FDOT to work with us further in their design utilizing the existing models developed for the Old Tampa Bay region.

We would welcome the opportunity to talk with your science staff and FDOT about the results of the modeling efforts-- which indicate that incorporating modifications in the design of the planned Howard Frankland Bridge may provide benefits to Old Tampa Bay-- at this early stage of FDOT's planning efforts. Please don't hesitate to contact me to discuss further.

I look forward to your response.

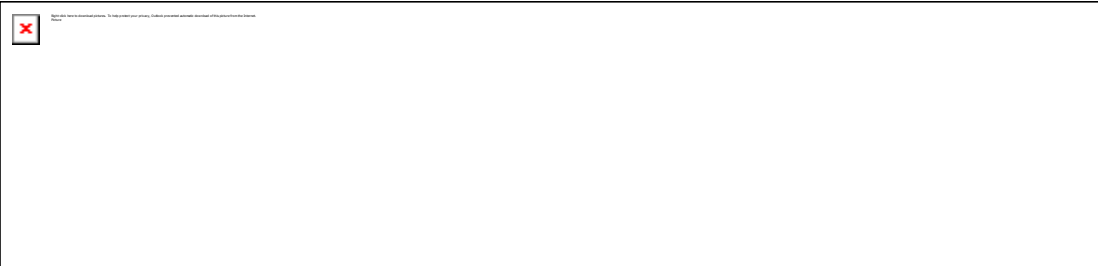

Hello,

My name is walter staggs, I live in councilman Newton's district. I am a disabled old coot, just trying to stay afloat and really did not mean to, nor still mean to cause a bother...

My shower handles started to leak, so I have saved from my checks to get the parts to fix my shower, and put in a small vanity, too. I bought one of those water shutoff valve keys (kind of flimsy, not a big thing like the city workers use), but could not get the valve at the meter to turn.

I wrote an email to the City Water People, just asking if someone would come out and use one of their big shutoff keys and/or give the thing a squirt to unfreeze it.

I got a condescending email from a Mr. DiNobile, who very in factually schooled me that it is neither the City of St. Petersburg's duty, nor inclination to help a tax paying citizen. 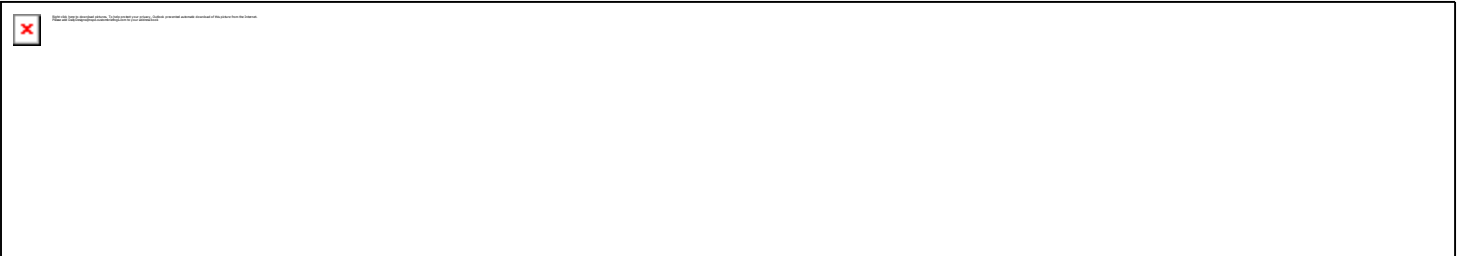

Leading the News

Supreme Court Set To Hear Challenge To Mercury Regulations.

[Reuters](#) (3/25, Hurley) reports that on Wednesday, the US Supreme Court will hear a challenge to the Obama administration's regulations intended to limit emissions of mercury and other pollutants, mainly from coal-fired power plants. After an appeals court upheld the regulations last summer, industry groups and some state governments appealed to the Supreme Court. The case will examine whether the EPA should have considered compliance costs when designing the regulations.

[USA Today](#) (3/25, Wolf) describes the regulations as being able to "could save thousands of lives each year" but at the "cost billions of dollars." The challenge is the "latest in a series of environmental cases to come before the court," and while the court's "conservative majority has tread lightly on President Obama's initiatives," a "bigger showdown over ozone regulations could be yet to come."

In an editorial, the [Washington Post](#) (3/25) says that to overturn the regulations, those challenging them "must convince the court that the agency was wholly unreasonable in the way it interpreted the Clean Air Act's command to regulate hazardous air pollution when 'appropriate,'" and that's a "high legal hurdle" which the challengers "aren't anywhere close" to clearing.

DOT's IG Launches Audit Of State Highway Spending.

[The Hill](#) (3/25, Laing) reports that the DOT is conducting an audit on state highway spending. According to the article, the DOT's Office of Inspector General (IG) said the audit is aimed at ensuring that "federal funding that is allocated to states is being properly used." The Hill adds that the IG indicated that the FHWA's State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) provides over \$37 billion yearly for bridge and road construction. The IG is quoted as stating, "The objective of this audit is to assess FHWA policies, procedures, and guidance for ensuring that STIPs receive comprehensive, consistent reviews and meet federal requirements, including coordination with the Federal Transit Administration."

Bipartisan Cybersecurity Bill Introduced In House.

[Reuters](#) (3/25, Zengerle) reports that House Intelligence Committee Chairman Devin Nunes on Tuesday introduced new legislation on Tuesday designed to encourage companies to share information about cybersecurity threats with the government without fear of lawsuits. The Protecting Cyber Networks Act has bipartisan backing, and Reuters says that it has a good chance of passing the House.

[McClatchy](#) (3/25, Doyle, Subscription Publication) reports that that House Intelligence Chair Devin Nunes and Ranking Member Adam Schiff approach their jobs differently. Nunes avoids the spotlight, while Schiff regularly appears on the Sunday shows. Still, the piece notes their ability to work together despite their differing approach to the job, on issues such as the cybersecurity bill.

Republicans Pitch Budget Amendment To Let States Opt Out Of Clean Power Plan.

On Tuesday, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) put forward a budgetary amendment to allow states to opt out of the Environmental Protection Agency's Clean Power Plan, which seeks to reduce greenhouse-gas emissions from the nation's power plants by 30% by 2030. The Senate could vote on the budget this week.

[The Hill](#) (3/25, Cama) reports that McConnell proposed the amendment "on behalf of Sen. Rob Portman," the junior senator from Ohio "who is up for reelection in 2016." The amendment would give either the "governor or legislature" of a state the option of being exempted from the EPA rule for a number of reasons, including the cost of the rule on "low-income or fixed-income households," the risk to grid reliability, the possibility of reduced "investments in power plants," and harm to a state's manufacturing sector or to its overall employment and tax base. Additionally, on Monday, House Republicans presented "another kind of opt-out for states" that would allow governors to "veto any compliance plan for the rule," although this proposal "would not completely shield states from complying like Portman's amendment."

Senate Bill Sets Seven-Year "Sunset" For Federal Rules.

[The Hill](#) (3/25, Wheeler) reports that Sen. Mark Kirk (R-IL) on Tuesday introduced a bill, the Small Business Regulatory Sunset Act, that would impose on federal agencies "a seven-year expiration date or 'sunset' on final rules" once they're published. If a rule isn't renewed by its issuing agency within seven years, it expires. According to The Hill, "market research and advocacy groups," including the Competitive Enterprise Institute and Citizens Against Government Waste, urged senators in an open letter issued Tuesday to pass Kirk's bill. The letter cites data from NAM research showing that the cost of regulatory compliance for small businesses was, on average, \$11,724 per employee in 2012 and \$34,67 for small manufacturers. Since 1993, federal agencies have issued over 87,000 rules, The Hill noted.

Research and Funding

Researchers Develop Sidewinding S&R Robot.

[The Engineer](#) (3/25) reports that researchers at Carnegie Mellon University and the Georgia Institute of Technology were inspired by sidewinder snakes to develop "a robot designed for entering dangerous environments." The researchers studied the snakes "to work out how to make their robot take rapid and sharp turns as it moved." The article reports that snakes are "a popular model for robot builders," noting that researchers are exploring "how robotic reptiles might be used for dangerous and difficult tasks from decommissioning nuclear power stations to exploring Mars."

University Of Akron Researcher Gets NIH Grant To Study Heart Healing Technology.

The [Crain's Cleveland Business](#) (3/24) reports that University of Akron researcher Ge "Christie" Zhang, assistant professor of biomedical engineering, has received a \$459,992 grant from the National Institutes of Health "to further research into a technology that could heal cardiac muscle that dies as the result of a heart attack."

Chattanooga, U-T Knoxville, Oak Ridge Lab Partake In "Connected Vehicle" Pilot.

[WRCB-TV](#) Chattanooga, TN (3/24, Heron) reports Chattanooga, TN transportation officials got the approval on Tuesday from the City Council to take part in the "Connected Vehicle Pilot Development" project along with teams from the University of Tennessee-Knoxville and Oak Ridge National Laboratory. WRCB says the pilot project will start testing connected vehicle technology, which will hopefully make traveling around Chattanooga "more efficient, especially for trucks."

Education

Recommendations Can Help Community College STEM Students.

[US News & World Report](#) (3/24, Boyington) reports that according to NCES data, most community college STEM majors never earn their degrees, despite community colleges being good "starting points" for STEM students. The piece cites a Hanover Research report listing a number of obstacles that hinder the progress of many such students, and offers a number of recommendations by which students seeking "the benefits of community college and a STEM career can set themselves up for success." Such steps include sharpening math skills, finding mentors, and utilizing colleges' STEM resources beyond the classroom.

Roads and Highways

Jenkins Sees Tesla Eventually Being Bought By Traditional Auto Company.

In his column for the [Wall Street Journal](#) (3/25, Subscription Publication), Holman W. Jenkins Jr. argues that Tesla, despite claims to the contrary, is not a disruptive company, as it doesn't significantly change the automotive experience. He says that eventually, Tesla, which loses money, may have to sell out to a larger car company that needs the brand name to sell electric vehicles, as demanded by the President's fuel economy rules.

"Common Sense" Fix Needed To Prevent Train-Truck Collisions.

In a 1,100- word article, the [AP](#) (3/25, Waggoner) reports that railroads are seeking to extend the deadline to implement positive train control (PTC). Congress has required that railroads implement the system by the end of this year. Meanwhile, the article notes that experts have said that PTC will not prevent collisions between trucks and trains unless both industries adopt a "common sense" fix: "actually talking with each other before crossing into each other's territory." The report notes that the AP found that there were no Federal regulations or laws reinforced by "stiff criminal or civil penalties" that "specifically requires coordination between truck and train operators." Rob Molloy, acting director of highway safety for the NTSB, is quoted as saying, "It is crazy that this doesn't get coordinated with the railroad, considering how difficult this operation can be and how long it takes to cross it." Acting FRA Administrator Sarah Feinberg is also quoted in the article as saying, "If you are trying to take an unexpected or surprising or complicated load over railroad tracks ... you should be letting the railroad know you are planning to do that and coordinating." The [AP](#) (3/25) also has additional coverage of the story in a separate report.

Policy Analyst Argues Against Extending PTC Deadline. In commentary appearing in the [Center for Effective Government's](#) (3/25) blog, policy analyst Amanda Frank argues against giving railroads additional time to implement PTC. Frank mentions that the NTSB is also opposed to offering the railroads any time extensions, noting that the agency has been "advocating for PTC since 1970." She later writes that implementing PTC will "do more than simply reduce engineer error; it can speed other improvements in rail safety."

Energy

First Research Wind Turbines To Be Placed Off Virginia Coast.

The [AP](#) (3/24) reports that the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management issued a lease to Dominion Virginia Power for two 500-foot research wind turbines 25 miles off the coast from Virginia Beach. The turbines will collect data used to determine the wind power potential of the open sea site and both are expected to be operational in 2017.

Please help to protect our homes. The City of Saint Petersburg Building Services department had issued a moratorium on piling pounding in our sinkhole ridden area . Please see attached email letter from Rick Dunn. The two homes built for homeowners (712 & 730 14th Av. N.) were mandated by the city to use the non-destructive, expensive Augur Cast System. The spec builder for lot (727- 13th Av N) has been issued a permit (1412000950) allowing piling pounding which likely will cause damage to our homes that we have paid to have extensive sinkhole remediation. The three previous homes on the contiguous lots were torn down years ago due to documented sinkhole activity, two successfully litigated.

I was invited to a permit review meeting yesterday 3/23/15 and after the non productive meeting my neighbors and I found out that the permit had been issued earlier in the day?

Please have the building services department continue to mandate the no piling pounding.

Please let me know your thoughts. I would like to meet with you so you could firsthand look through my documentation.

PCS/HB 933 -- Growth Management

In a desperate attempt to move stalled legislation in the House, late yesterday the Economic Development and Tourism Subcommittee filed PCS/HB 933 consolidating at least a half dozen growth management bills into a single piece of legislation which would undermine statewide and local community planning. The Subcommittee has put PCS/HB 933 on its Wednesday, March 25 agenda in an attempt to circumvent the deliberative committee process for individual bills.

[PCS/HB 933](#) ties some reasonable provisions intended to clarify certain areas of law with others that are simply terrible public policy. Particularly disturbing, the first section of the bill would **strip local governments of the authority to make development decisions on certain agricultural parcels** for the benefit of a single politically-connected developer in Palm Beach County.

PCS/HB 933 combines six bills into one by including language dealing with "constrained agricultural parcels" (HB 1175), DRI program elimination (HB 579), sector plans (HB 933), Regional Planning Councils (HB 873), "connected city corridors" (HB 1159), and a new required private property rights element in local comprehensive plans (HB 551). Additional language **limits mobility and impact fees, addresses stabilization of properties impacted by subsidence and sink holes, and prohibits local governments from requiring developers to pay for vegetation removal.**

With the current session almost half over, this bill -- **a virtual special interest wish list** -- is meant to jam through controversial and damaging bills by attaching them to less controversial measures and limiting opportunities for public debate and thoughtful consideration.

With so many moving parts, and too little time to fully understand the consequences of such a broad piece of legislation, **PCS/HB 933 needs to be stopped now.**

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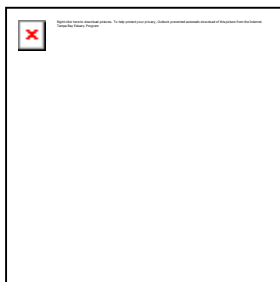

2014 Report: Water Quality in Tampa Bay Gets A Green Light For Third Straight Year

All major segments of Tampa Bay met water quality goals in 2014, for the third year in a row. This marks the first time since monitoring began that water quality in all four major bay segments met targets for three consecutive years.

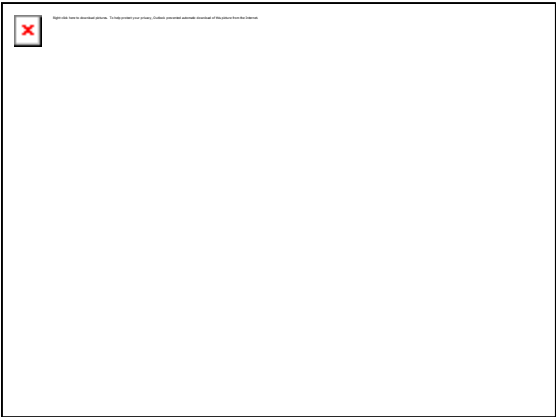

TBEP Awards \$83,000 in Community Mini-Grants

The Tampa Bay Estuary Program recently awarded \$83,000 to 20 community groups for projects that directly involve citizens in restoring and improving Tampa Bay. [Click here](#) to see a complete list of recipients and their projects.

The rating system considers the amount of microscopic algae in the water (as indicated by chlorophyll-a, a plant pigment), as well as the amount of visible sunlight penetrating the water column.

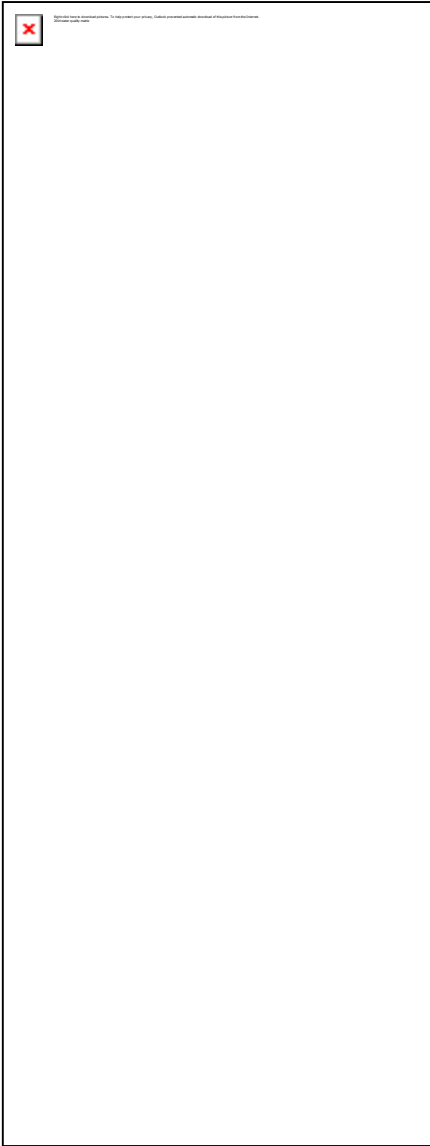
"Green" means a bay segment is meeting water quality targets, while "red" means it is not. "Yellow" indicates that the area bears watching.

The 2014 analysis shows a green light across the board for all four major bay segments: Hillsborough Bay, Old Tampa Bay, Middle Tampa Bay, and Lower Tampa Bay. This means that water quality is good enough to foster continued recovery of underwater seagrasses.

Since 1999, seagrasses have been expanding on the bay bottom at a rate of 738 acres per year.

The toxic algae *Pyrodinium bahamense* was reported in Old Tampa Bay during summer 2014, but the blooms were not severe enough to affect annual water quality results. Likewise, a non-harmful bloom of *Neoceratium hircus* algae in Hillsborough Bay in September fueled by runoff from the Alafia River did not alter overall results for this segment.

The data used for the report card is collected monthly by the Environmental Protection Commission of Hillsborough County, from 45 sampling stations all over the bay.



This year's Bay Mini-Grant program attracted 30 applicants. Members of the Estuary Program's Community Advisory Committee evaluated the grant proposals, recommending 20 for full funding. Grant requests were eligible for as little as \$500 up to \$5,000.

Funding for the grants comes from sales of the **Tampa Bay Estuary license plate**.

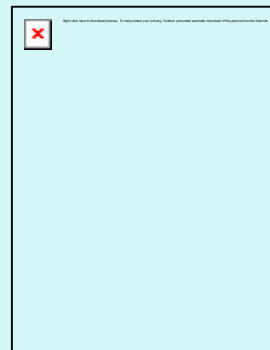

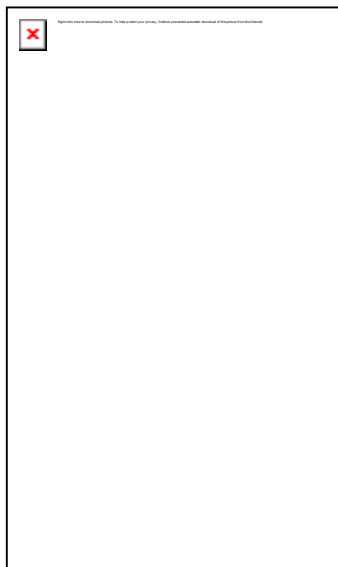


A Fond Farewell

In a desperate attempt to move stalled legislation in the House, late yesterday the Economic Development and Tourism Subcommittee filed [PCS/HB 933](#) consolidating at least a half dozen growth management bills into a single piece of legislation which would undermine statewide and local community planning. The Subcommittee has put PCS/HB 933 on its **Wednesday, March 25** agenda in an attempt to circumvent the deliberative committee process for individual bills.

PCS/HB 933 -- Growth Management

[PCS/HB 933](#) ties some reasonable provisions intended to clarify certain areas of law with others that are simply terrible public policy. Particularly disturbing, the first section of the bill would **strip local governments of the authority to make development decisions on certain agricultural parcels** for the benefit of a single politically-connected developer in Palm Beach County.

PCS/HB 933 combines six bills into one by including language dealing with "constrained agricultural parcels" (HB 1175), DRI program elimination (HB 579), sector plans (HB 933), Regional Planning Councils (HB 873), "connected city corridors" (HB 1159), and a new required private property rights element in local comprehensive plans (HB 551). Additional language **limits mobility and impact fees, addresses stabilization of properties impacted by**

subsidence and sink holes, and prohibits local governments from requiring developers to pay for vegetation removal.

With the current session almost half over, this bill -- **a virtual special interest wish list** -- is meant to jam through controversial and damaging bills by attaching them to less controversial measures and limiting opportunities for public debate and thoughtful consideration.

With so many moving parts, and too little time to fully understand the consequences of such a broad piece of legislation, **PCS/HB 933 needs to be stopped now.**

St. Petersburg Mayor Rick Kriseman's bid to dedicate more tourism tax dollars to capital projects countywide suffered a setback Wednesday when it failed to win the endorsement of the Pinellas Tourist Development Council.

The council, of which Kriseman is a member, voted 7-4 to recommend to the Pinellas County Commission that spending on capital projects such as sports stadiums account for no more than 40 percent of the revenue raised by the county's tourism tax. Kriseman favored a second option offered by county staff that would set a 50 percent cap, which would make more money available for projects such as renovating Al Lang Stadium and the recently announced plan to build an 1,800-seat baseball stadium at Walter Fuller Field, both in St. Petersburg.

At White House Science Fair, Obama Announces New STEM Commitments.

The [New York Times](#) (3/23, Shear, Subscription Publication) describes President Obama as being awed by the accomplishments of the children who on Monday presented their inventions at the White House Science Fair, and notes that in brief remarks he announced "\$240 million in new commitments from the government and private businesses to help children succeed in science, technology and math," part of an initiative known as STEM. However, adds the Times, "it was clear that" for Obama, "the best part of the day was spending time with the young inventors."

The [AP](#) (3/24, Kuhnhehn), meanwhile, notes that "the pledges the president announced include a \$150 million philanthropic effort to encourage promising early-career scientists to stay on track and a \$90 million campaign to expand STEM opportunities to underrepresented youth, such as minorities and girls." Said Obama, "It's not enough for our country just to be proud of you. We've got to support you."

NAE Announces Plan To Graduate 20,000 “Grand Challenge Engineers.” The [National Academy of Engineering](#) has announced that “more than 120 US engineering schools” presented President Obama with a letter of commitment at the White House Science Fair announcing “plans to educate a new generation of engineers expressly equipped to tackle some of the most pressing issues facing society in the 21st century.” The piece explains that these “Grand Challenges” involve “complex yet critical goals such as engineering better medicines, making solar energy cost-competitive with coal, securing cyberspace, and advancing personalized learning tools to deliver better education to more individuals.” Each school pledged to graduate at least 20 students every year “specially prepared to lead the way in solving such large-scale problems, with the goal of training more than 20,000 formally recognized ‘Grand Challenge Engineers’ over the next decade.”

Public Safety

Compensation For Those Killed Due To GM Defective Cars Stands At 74.

The [AP](#) (3/23) reports that the updated total of the GM fund to compensate victims' families of the defective ignition switches stands at 74 people killed in crashes related to the defect. The story says number approved for payout went up seven from last week's total of 67. The fund is managed by attorney Kenneth Feinberg. The AP says an additional 126 injured people have also been determined to be eligible for compensation.

Law and Policy

Broadband Providers Sue FCC Over Net Neutrality Regulations.

The [Los Angeles Times](#) (3/24, Puzzanghera) reports “an expected lengthy court fight” over new net neutrality regulations began with broadband providers alleging in lawsuits against the Federal Communications Commission that rules are “arbitrary, capricious, and an abuse of discretion.” Meanwhile, an FCC spokesperson said the lawsuits “are premature and subject to dismissal.”

EPA’s Power Plant Mercury Emissions Regulations Criticized.

In an op-ed in the [Wall Street Journal](#) (3/24, Subscription Publication), Brian Potts, a partner at the international law firm Foley & Lardner LLP, criticizes the EPA's regulation of mercury emissions from power plants. The regulations are now being considered by the Supreme Court. Potts argues that the EPA admits that the regulations wouldn't greatly affect US mercury deposition, and suggests that the agency's assumptions in calculating the harm from the pollution are ridiculous. He concludes that economic losses due to the children hurt by mercury are outweighed by the costs of complying with the rules.

Research and Funding

Researchers Make Strides In Metamaterial Applications.

The [New York Times](#) (3/24, Markoff, Subscription Publication) reports on advances researchers have made in recent years about the science of metamaterials, noting that they are “generating innovations in an array of fields, including radio antennas, radar, cosmetics, soundproofing and walls that help protect against earthquakes and tsunamis.” The piece explains that such materials are “constructed with subcomponents that are smaller than the wavelength of the type of radiation they are designed to manipulate.” Moreover, there are “obvious markets for the technology in automotive safety and self-driving cars.”

Rochester Institute Of Technology Emerges As Drone Research Leader.

The [Rochester \(NY\) Democrat & Chronicle](#) (3/19) reports that Rochester Institute of Technology, long seen as a leader in aerial and satellite imaging, “has now emerged as one of the world's leading centers for research on drones, small unmanned aircraft.” The head of the school's Center for Imaging Science, David Messinger, “says he gets calls almost every week from companies seeking this expertise, and graduating students are in extraordinarily high demand.” The piece notes that graduates from the school's Digital Imaging and Remote Sensing Lab are “highly sought after by government and industry alike.”

Ohio State Researchers Bend Sound, Manipulate Temperature With Magnetic Fields.

The [Columbus \(OH\) Dispatch](#) (3/23) reports on research published by two Ohio State University researchers in the journal Nature Materials describing “how to bend sound and adjust temperature using magnetic fields.” The article reports that the university says the

“researchers are the first to prove that tiny particles of heat and sound are magnetic,” meaning that these acoustic phonons “can be controlled by magnetic fields.”

Northwest University Researchers Working On Underwater Router.

The [Boston Herald](#) (3/24) reports that Northwest University researcher Tommaso Melodia is working on “the first underwater smartphone or wireless router,” noting that the school lured the “highly cited researcher who is pioneering subaquatic Wi-Fi” from SUNY Buffalo. The piece notes that the National Science Foundation has given Melodia a \$300,000 grant “to expand his research, this time focusing on the possibility of real-time underwater video streaming.”

Education

California State Legislator Advocates New, Science-Based UC.

California state Assemblyman Mike Gatto (D-Glendale) writes an op-ed to the [Los Angeles Times](#) (3/23, Gatto) to counter a previous blog post from the Times’ Karin Klein. Gatto argues that elite UCs are at maximum capacity and will experience growing pressure that could be handled with increased capacity stemming from a new UC that focused on STEAM subjects, “practical subject areas that generate the best-paying jobs.” He notes that many high-merit students are rejected from UCs and often leave the state, which poses a long-term problem, and that students currently at UCs find themselves in a high-cost environment that did not allow ample interaction with professors. While he admits that there are short-term challenges that must be addressed, he notes that California is expected to grow, and the state’s “educational superiority” has always depended on planning for “long-term higher-educational needs.”

Roads and Highways

US Drivers Log The Most Cumulative Miles Since 2007.

The [Detroit News](#) (3/23, Shepardson) reports that “Americans drove 3.02 trillion miles in 2014, up 1.7 percent over 2013,” marking the highest cumulative miles driven since 2007 when Americans logged 3.03 trillion miles. “Americans are driving their cars at near-record levels, and being stuck in traffic is costing drivers an average of nearly five days a year,” said Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx. “To ensure this problem doesn’t get worse, greater innovations and investments are needed. We can’t keep treating America’s 21st-century traffic needs with 20th-century solutions.”

The [Detroit Bureau](#) (3/23) reports “Data like these are critical to helping federal and state transportation leaders understand the challenges facing American drivers,” said FHWA Deputy Administrator Gregory Nadeau in a press release.

[CNBC](#) (3/23, Strong) provides additional coverage.

Percentage of Age 50+ Drivers Growing In the US. The [Detroit News](#) (3/23, Shepardson) reports that the FHWA announced on Monday there are 93.5 million drivers in the US over age 50, accounting for 44.1 percent of all drivers as of 2013. The Detroit News writes that the increase in older drivers should encourage lawmakers to give greater attention to policies that make roads safer and easier to navigate for older drivers. “From brighter, more visible highway signs and lane markings to pedestrian countdown signals, our research has done much to keep America’s aging population safe,” Nadeau said.

Shutdown Of Transportation Projects Begins In Four States.

[The Hill](#) (3/23, Laing) reports that the “uncertainty of federal transportation funding is already causing state and local governments to cancel construction projects,” according to DC infrastructure advocates. The current Federal transportation funding bill is set to expire in May as Congress debate a way to pay for the extension. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx told a March 19 infrastructure forum in DC that four states – Georgia, Wyoming, Arkansas and Tennessee – have “already announced they were having to put a hold on projects as they wait for Congress to clear up the federal program uncertainty,” according to the AASHTO website.

Proposal In Congress To Allow Local Gov Direct Access To Federal Transportation Funds. The [Streets Blog](#) (3/23, Schmitt) reports “A bipartisan coalition of 10 lawmakers is supporting the Innovation in Surface Transportation Act,” which would assist local jurisdictions in “directly access federal funding for transportation projects,” according to Transportation for America. The proposal was first raised in 2014 and would allow local governments to compete for at least “\$5 billion of the \$50 billion” in Federal transportation funds allocated annually. According to the Blog Sen. Roger Wicker (R-MS), one of the bill’s sponsors, told DOT Secretary Anthony Foxx in a hearing two weeks ago that “local officials in his state are excited about the concept.”

I have attached 3 brochures; one describes R'Club since our acquisition of Coordinated Child Care of Pinellas last May; a second one that describes the Louise Graham Regeneration Center and one that describes our secure document destruction enterprise by that center. I have also included the Breakfast flyer.

It is that time again; our 8th Annual Celebration Breakfast for R'Club Child Care, Inc. and the Louise Graham Regeneration Center, Inc. (operated under the auspices of R'Club). Pinellas Sheriff Bob Gualtieri is serving once again as the Breakfast Committee Chairman and will make a few comments at the event. As you can see, we also have Trevor Burgess, President and CEO of C1 Bank and Representative Kathleen Peters as speakers.

We have moved to a new venue, the new Banquet Masters (see flyer) as our event outgrew the space at Ruth Eckerd Hall. We hosted 370 guests last year and are planning on 400 this May 20th. This successful fundraiser begins at 7:30 am and always ends before 9:00.

Both R'Club and LGRC have had significant growth in the past year and will continue to grow in the coming year and beyond. R'Club completed an asset acquisition of a 40 year old not for profit, Coordinated Child Care of Pinellas, Inc. (CCC) last May 30th; adding 50 employees and several children's programs and increasing our annual operating budget by approximately \$5,000,000. Besides the 2 early learning centers in the north Greenwood area that came with the CCC acquisition, R'Club opened two new centers in St. Petersburg in August 2014. Our before and after school programs, our preschools, and our HIPPY program serve the entire county of Pinellas, targeting some of our county's most vulnerable and at risk families, including through a partnership with the Homeless Emergency Project in Clearwater.

The Lew Williams Center for Early Learning at Pinellas Technical College across from Gibbs High in south St. Pete targeting low income at risk children from 1-5 years of age is a partnership between Pinellas Schools, the Early Learning Coalition of Pinellas, the Juvenile Welfare Board, Lutheran Services Head Start and R'Club with R'Club operating the center. The goal is to provide high quality early learning for at risk young children getting them ready for school and in a year, to provide professional development for child care professionals in the community in order to increase the expertise in the field. Child Care students from Gibbs and PTC are already getting involved in the learning opportunities at the Center. The second center that opened in August is the R'Club Early Learning Academy at ASI (American Strategic Insurance); a corporate partnership designed and operated for ASI employees and the general community. It is a fabulous center that really needs to be seen to be fully appreciated and is a prime example of the commitment to the community from ASI and their CEO, John Auer.

The Louise Graham Center has increased the number of disabled clients it serves by more than 15%, increased shredding contracts, employment opportunities for its clients and diversified employment

opportunities with more packaging projects. Shredding some 100,000 pounds of paper monthly and 50 tons of newspaper weekly is providing great employment opportunities for more folks with developmental disabilities. A recent expansion into competitive job development and job coaching has been rewarding with competitive job opportunities for some clients at very competitive wages. On one packaging project, our clients packaged 72,000 9-volt batteries in mailers for home owner insurance policy holders for Ark Royal and did so in record time. The clients earned more than minimum wage for the piece work and the insurance company is expanding the contract.

A legislative project, endorsed by our entire legislative delegation, if successful, will provide a solar power opportunity for the center. It will enable us to redirect an average of \$1250 to \$2000 of electric expense to more program services and as the center continues to grow and increase its shredding and recycling operations, enable even more funds to be used to support services. How fitting, that a recycling operation with Regeneration in its name, generates its own electricity.

Our boards and our families very much appreciate your faith and support and hope to count on you to sponsor a Table, purchase a ticket or two and attend this growing event, or simply support our efforts with your generosity. I promise that we will be good stewards of your generosity and will accomplish much for the children and their families and the disabled adults we serve through R' Club and the Louise Graham Center.

I look forward to talking with you and seeing you at the May 20th Breakfast, if not before.

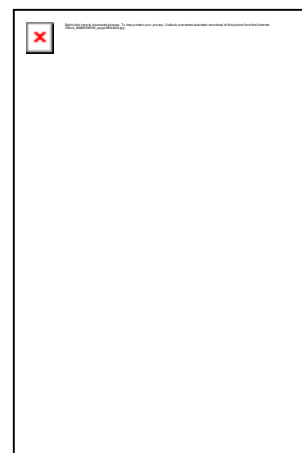

Long Overdue Changes for Juvenile Records Moving

Children Tried as Adults Bill Passes First Stop

HB 783 sponsored by Rep. Edwards (D-Sunrise) prohibits certain juvenile offenders from being transferred to adult court and deletes provisions relating to sentencing of juveniles as adults for certain offenses. The bill was heard and passed by the House Criminal Justice Subcommittee this week, following two amendments. 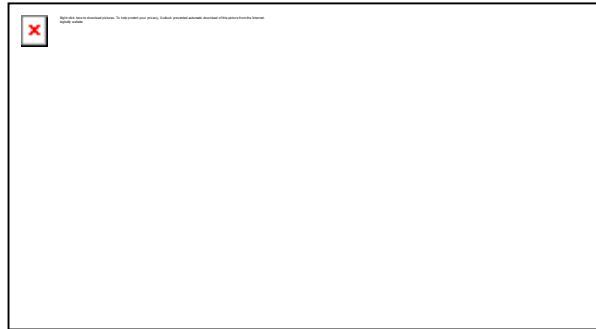

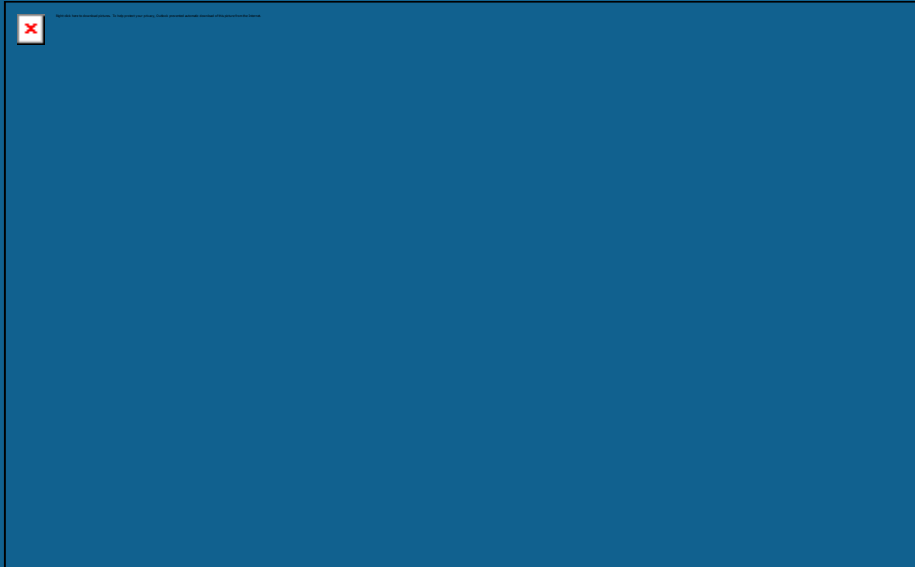

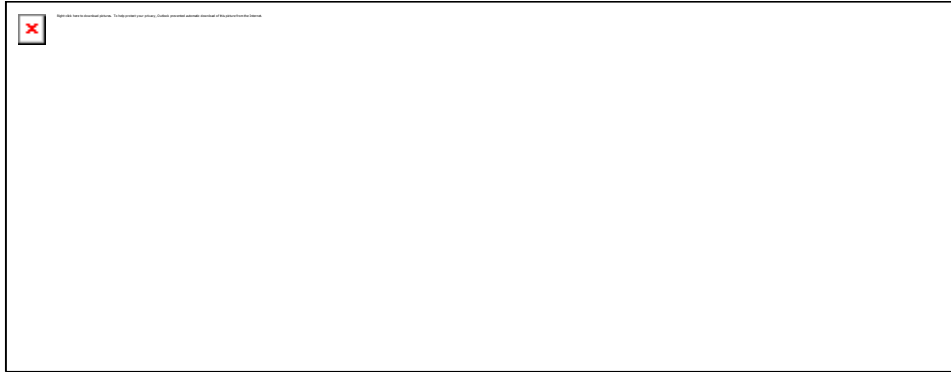

The City of St. Petersburg has a long partnership history with the Tampa Bay Estuary Program (TBEP) as one of the original signatories on our formal Interlocal Government Agreement. Councilman Kornell sits on our Policy Board, and Mike Connors is the Chairman of our Management Board.

TBEP has its own specialty license plate also known as the "Tarpon Tag".

Revenues from the tag are returned to the community in the form of mini-grants to citizen groups, schools and non-profit organizations.

Projects funded through this program must be directly linked to the goals of the Tampa Bay Estuary Program's Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plan.

Eligible projects include habitat restoration, pollution prevention and environmental education initiatives.

Since the program's inception, more than \$1.6 million has been awarded throughout the bay area. Just in the last 6 funding cycles, more than \$182,000 has gone to community groups and schools within the City of St. Petersburg.

I would like to request St. Pete's Marketing and Communications Department consider helping us promote our license plate and grant program via the SUNblast and/or the Events News from City of St. Petersburg.

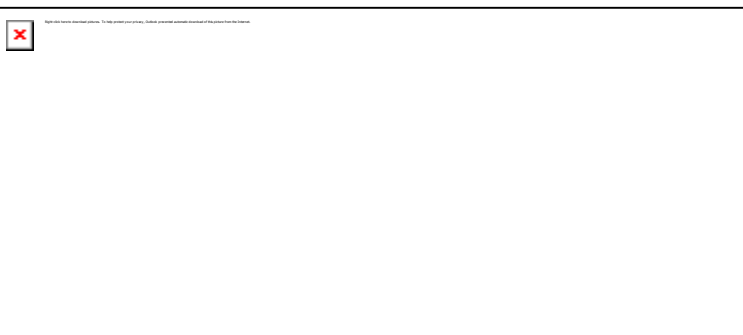


EU Environment Commissioner Karmenu Vella at the opening of the EU Water Conference 2015!

Leading the News

Administration Presents New Rules On Fracking.

The [Washington Post](#) (3/21, Warrick) reported on the Obama administration's "most significant effort to tighten standards for hydraulic fracturing," or fracking, by announcing Friday, according to the [AP](#) (3/21, Daly, Lederman), that it's "requiring companies that drill for oil and natural gas on federal lands to disclose chemicals used" in fracking operations. The new rule, which takes effect in June, "also updates requirements for well construction and disposal of water and other fluids" used in fracking, the AP said.

[The Hill](#) (3/21, Cama) reported that the oil and gas industry "wasted little time" in responding to the new rules with a lawsuit. The Independent Petroleum Association of America and the Western Energy Alliance filed their complaint "less than an hour after" the Interior Department's announcement. The suit "accuses federal regulators of promulgating 'a reaction to unsubstantiated concerns'" that are not based on evidence, the story said.

[McClatchy](#) (3/20, Cockerham, Subscription Publication) quoted Interior Secretary Sally Jewell as telling reporters that "many" current regulations "haven't kept pace with advances in technology."

Jewell “credited fracking with helping reduce” US “dependence on foreign oil to its lowest level in 30 years,” according to the [Los Angeles Times](#) (3/21, Susman), but it added that the secretary also said “public worries” warranted stricter controls on the process. According to Jewell: “There is a lot of fear. There’s a lot of public concern, particularly about the safety of groundwater.”

The [New York Times](#) (3/21, Davenport, Subscription Publication) noted that the “vast majority of fracking” in the US is done “on private or state-owned land,” and it cited Jewell as saying that although the new Environmental Protection Agency rules don’t apply to those operations, for many states “these may be the only regulations they have.” She went on to say that efforts to address fracking on state or private land “must now be taken up in statehouses and boardrooms across the country.”

Law and Policy

Quakes’ Effect On Infrastructure Examined.

The [Dallas Morning News](#) (3/20, Weiss) reported on the uncertainties accompanying the rise in tremors and quakes in Northern Texas. “We do not expect problems with our infrastructure during small-magnitude earthquake clusters, but our expectations are based on limited experience and subject to change,” said Ian Buckle, an engineering professor at the University of Nevada Reno. The article reports that in addition to potential cracks to structures, roads and bridges, there is a potential risk for water and sewer pipes and some were not designed with earthquakes in mind. “Are we worried? Of course we’re worried. ... But nobody has seen any impact,” said Randy Payton, assistant director for the Dallas Water Utilities department. “Unofficially, water equipment in the quake zone is getting an extra eyeballing,” the article reports. “There could be a pipe out there somewhere that is so badly corroded or a slip joint that is just at the point of pulling out,” said Douglas Nyman, who specializes in controlling natural hazards to oil and gas pipelines. “An earthquake might be just enough to trigger a problem.”

EPA Emissions Rules Face Legal Challenges.

The [Wall Street Journal](#) (3/23, Kendall, Harder, Subscription Publication) reports that while the Administration’s air pollution reduction initiatives have survived several court challenges, a new round of litigation could ultimately determine whether the most ambitious initiatives in that area will survive. The Supreme Court is scheduled to hear arguments on Wednesday over EPA regulations that require power plants to reduce emissions of mercury and other air pollutants, and next month, a Federal appeals court will consider a legal challenge to the EPA’s proposal to reduce carbon emissions from coal-fired power plants.

Research and Funding

Engineering Students Build Device To Extinguish Fires With Sound Waves.

The [Washington Post](#) (3/22, Jackman) reports that two engineering students at George Mason University have developed a way to extinguish fires with sound waves from a bass frequency generator. Although the students have only put out fires started with rubbing alcohol, they plan to “continue to refine” the device. Since applying for a provisional patent last November, a local fire department has already asked the pair “to test their bass waves on a structure fire” as a way to potentially “replace the toxic and messy chemicals involved in fire extinguishers.”

Self-Driving Cars Making Progress, Start Cross-Country Road Test.

[ABC World News](#) (3/22, story 10, 2:05, Llamas) reported on an Audi SUV that is driving coast-to-coast “without a human driver, just an engineer behind the wheel, hands-free.” The trip from San Francisco to New York is described as a “critical road test for the self-driving car.” There is a brief interview with Matt Lewis, Systems Engineer at Delphi Labs, who says self-driving cars can pick up on cars entering their lanes “much faster than a human,” and the car is “set up to drive very conservatively.” Karl Bruaer, senior analyst at Kelly Blue Book is quoted as saying “we’re about five years away” from self driving cars, “and even then it will probably only be done under certain circumstances.”

Education

University Of Illinois Launches College Of Medicine With Engineering Focus.

[USA Today](#) (3/22, Castillo) reports on the decision by the University of Illinois to start “the nation’s first college of medicine, which will have an integration in both engineering and medicine.” It is the first new college established at the university in “almost 60 years.” The university

is partnering with Carle Health System in developing the college. The college will offer MD-MS degrees as well as MD-PhD degrees. It is hoping to produce “physician scientists, physician engineers and physician entrepreneurs.” The College of Medicine at the university “will be entirely dependent on tuition, clinical revenue, philanthropy, grants and contracts,” and will receive no state funding. A Harvard-MIT program in Health Sciences and Technology “trains physician-scientists who want to have a research component to their career.”

Workforce

Former Twitter Engineer Sues Over “Secretive,” Discriminatory Promotional System.

The [San Francisco Chronicle](#) (3/22) reports that Tina Huang, a former Twitter engineer, has sued the firm alleging that its “‘secretive’ promotional system favors men.” Huang’s class action lawsuit comes amid similar complaints against firms in and out of the tech sector.

[TIME](#) (3/22) reports that Huang has sued Twitter “for gender discrimination while two other high-profile sexism lawsuits unfold in Silicon Valley.” Huang said that Twitter’s “unfairly favors men” and that the firm “has no formal procedures for granting promotions, and instead relies on a ‘shoulder tap’ process that explains why few women are in high-level engineering positions.” The article notes that Facebook is facing a similar allegation.

Roads and Highways

Honda Promotes Manufacturing To Students.

The [Columbus \(OH\) Dispatch](#) (3/21, Gearino) reported on Honda North America’s launch last week in Marysville of an initiative aimed at promoting “manufacturing careers to students in Ohio middle schools, high schools and colleges.” In the project’s first year, the auto maker plans to spend \$1 million on scholarships, mobile labs, and an educational video game, among other items, Honda officials said at kickoff event at a technical training center where “students and leaders from local schools” also gathered. The company cited a study by the NAM-affiliated Manufacturing Institute that concluded “there will be 3.4 million job openings in manufacturing in the next decade,” but 2 million of them — about 60% — won’t be filled due to an insufficient number of qualified or interested candidates.

[Automotive News](#) (3/20, Boudette) said Honda’s “multifaceted effort” at preparing its future work force will entail funding 12 scholarships of \$2,500 each for students who choose to study manufacturing; establishing a work-study program with Columbus State Community College; and setting up a science and technology high school program in Marysville, where Honda opened its first US auto assembly plant in 1982. “We see a potential challenge down the road” in finding enough workers with science, technology, and math skills for the auto maker’s four Ohio plants, said Rick Schostek, executive vice president of Honda North America. “We are seeing a lack of interest in manufacturing as a career.” Automotive News also cited the Manufacturing Institute study, co-published by Deloitte.

Grants To Assist Cleveland-Area Manufacturers With Job Training. [Crain’s Cleveland Business](#) (3/20, McCafferty) reported on the start last week of a Job Training Grant Program sponsored by the Greater Cleveland Partnership and Citizens Commercial Banking and designed to help “middle-market manufacturers better train their employees.” Companies that receive a grant under the program will be eligible for up to \$5,000 in matching funds to train current employees. At a forum hosted by the two groups, interested companies were given details about the grants, and they heard a speech from Gardner Carrick, vice president of strategic initiatives for the Manufacturing Institute.

Energy

Environmental Group Concerned About Coal Provision In Ex-Im Bill.

[The Hill](#) (3/21, Needham) reported that the environmental group Friends of the Earth “expressed concerns” Friday that recently introduced bipartisan legislation in the Senate to reauthorize the Export-Import Bank could allow the lender to resume financing of coal plants in other countries, “regardless of whether they adopt carbon capture technology” as required under rules implemented in 2013. Sen. Joe Manchin (D-WV), “who pushed for the provision and eventually dropped it” from an Ex-Im reauthorization bill last year, has joined Sens. Mark Kirk (R-IL) and Heidi Heitkamp (D-ND) in sponsoring the new bill, which would provide for the Bank’s operation through September 2019. If implemented, the restriction “could reignite tensions between the coal industry, environmentalists and Democrats who have expressed concerns in the past about dropping” such regulations on the Bank and what plants it finances.

Lockheed Martin Ventures Into Renewable Energy And Environmental Projects.

The [Washington Post](#) (3/20, Davenport, Jayakumar) reported on defense contractor Lockheed Martin's ventures into renewable energy and environmental projects. CEO Marilyn Hewson "touts the ventures as growth opportunities" as defense spending is shrinking. Skeptical analysts say the effort is "unlikely to benefit shareholders" in the near term and that history suggests that defense contractors should "stick with what they know best."

Comments: The PD and E study includes a Location Hydraulics technical memorandum. Please verify this includes a bridge hydraulic scour analysis. The bridge foundations should be hydraulically analyzed and cost estimated for drilled shafts. Driven piles, due to the proximity of nearby residences, are not recommended. Traffic counts should include bicyclists, this is a heavily used bike route by higher speed road cyclists, and lower speed recreational cyclists, and the design should provide for both, as well as pedestrians. Also, consider taking boat traffic counts to identify the need to open the waterway during weekends or other periods during the construction phase, as part of the traffic detour study. Consider safety improvements to the intersection of Weedon Drive leading to Weedon Island Park. thanks TBG

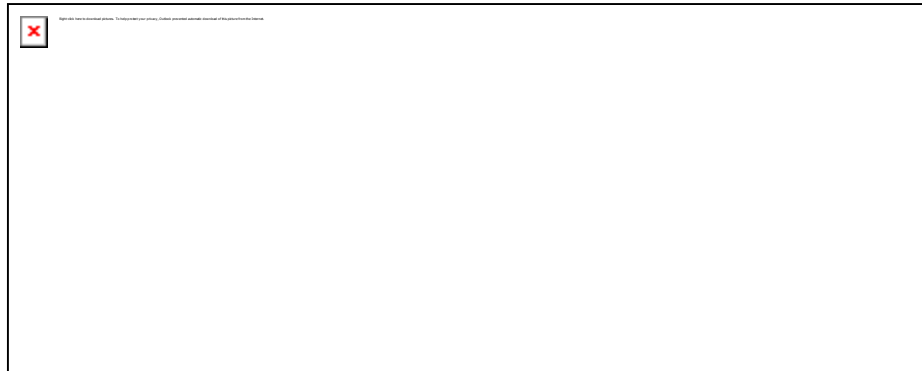

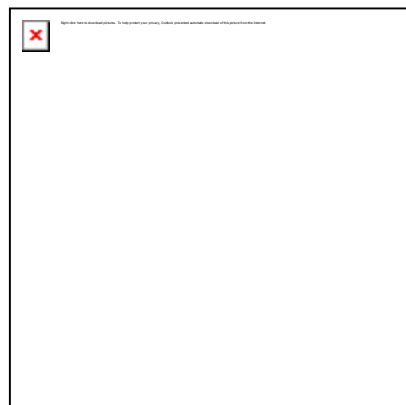

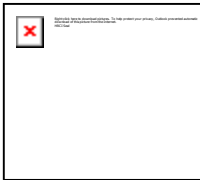

ST. PETERSBURG, FL (March 20, 2015) - As St. Petersburg readies for the excitement of IndyCar next week, about 1,200 farm workers, students, community groups and interfaith association members will march through downtown tomorrow, March 21, to promote fair treatment of farm workers and a fair wage.

The March for Fair Food, organized by the Coalition of Immokalee Workers, departs Bartlett Park at 1:30 p.m. The route will include Seventh Street South; 18th Avenue South; Fourth Street South; the northbound lanes of Fourth Street South; Eighth Avenue South; Third Street South (entire roadway) to north of Fifth Avenue South; the right two lanes of Third Street South; the eastbound lanes of Second Avenue North; Bayshore Drive and Fifth Avenue NE to Vinoy Park.

Uniformed officers will escort marchers to reduce congestion along city streets and at intersections; roads will reopen as the march passes along the route. There are no parking restrictions along the route. Marchers are expected to arrive at Vinoy Park around 2:30 p.m., where a Concert for Free Food will be held, featuring live music by Grammy Award winners Ozomatli and LaSanta Cecilia, along with Ruby Valle and the Soulphonics.

I generally only buy hard and soft flours; whole wheat and white. Hard/bread flours are best used for yeasted products such as bread. Soft/cake/pastry flour is best used for items leavened with baking power and baking soda, such as cookies, cakes, pancakes, biscuits. I rarely buy AP flour because I have the hard flour or soft flour in stock and use the appropriate flours as needed. I never buy self rising flour because I consider it a gimmick. I have always been fully capable of adding my own salt and leavening agents to my flour to create my own "self-rising flour".

Leading the News

Engineering Education Being Transformed By 3-D Printing.

[US News & World Report](#) (3/19) reports that “additive manufacturing,” as represented by 3-D printing techniques, is “putting a new spin on graduate education in both engineering and industrial design.” The article touches on the expected growth of 3-D printing in the coming years, and notes that Carnegie Mellon University’s Institute for Complex Engineered Systems is “one of several academic research centers exploring” the bounds of additive manufacturing “through collaborations of faculty, students and companies.”

Public Safety

California City Joins Campaign To Improve Oil Train Safety.

The [Contra Costa \(CA\) Times](#) (3/20, Richards) reports the California city of Martinez has joined a campaign launched by the League of California Cities, urging Federal regulators to improve oil train safety. According to the article, the Martinez City Council recently approved signing on to a League of California Cities letter to the DOT, calling for stricter “safety measures regarding the rail shipment of hazardous materials through” the city.

Senators Urge NHTSA To Lay Foundation For Self-Driving Vehicles.

[The Hill](#) (3/20, Hattem) reports that in a letter Thursday to NHTSA Administrator Mark Rosekind, Sens. Cory Booker and Deb Fischer said that they want to make sure that the agency is laying the “foundation for autonomous vehicle technology.” In their letter, the senators said that they “look forward to working with” the agency to “accelerate” the technology’s safety benefits and “encourage states as they consider its potential.” Additionally, the lawmakers urged Rosekind to be “more flexible” with safety standards, which were developed for vehicles “with a driver and may not be relevant for the cars of the future,” the Hill notes.

Law and Policy

McConnell Urges States To Oppose Obama’s “War On Coal.”

The [New York Times](#) (3/19, Davenport, Subscription Publication) reports Senate Majority Leader McConnell has begun “an aggressive campaign to block President Obama’s climate change agenda in statehouses and courtrooms across the country, arenas far beyond Mr. McConnell’s official reach and authority.” His campaign is aimed at stopping a set of EPA regulations requiring states to reduce carbon pollution from coal-fired power plants, but since he is “limited in how he can use his role in the Senate to block regulations, he has taken the unusual step of reaching out to governors.”

Research and Funding

Researchers Create Method To Mass Produce Nanofibers.

[Phys](#) (3/20) reports that researchers at North Carolina State University worked with the university’s start-up company, Xanofi, to create a way “to fabricate polymer nanofibers on a massive scale,” leading to possible “applications in filtration, batteries and cell scaffolding.” A paper in the online publication Advanced Materials describes the process, which allowed the researchers to generate large quantities of nanofibers. The paper’s co-author and Xanofi CEO, Miles Wright, said the process was “paramount” to applying the method to nanomanufacturing.

Education

Engineering Programs Form Bridge Between Research And Consumer Markets.

[US News & World Report](#) (3/19) reports on a number of consumer products and processes that “were developed in the research lab by engineering graduate students, who have delivered or are delivering them to the marketplace.” The article describes several products of “‘translational research,’ or engineering conducted at the lab bench with an eye toward rapidly getting it to customers or, in a medical context, to the bedside.” The piece reports that engineering schools are increasingly embracing such research “reflecting the growing push to tailor graduate study ‘to be more driven by real-world experience – designing real systems and building things that work.’”

Also in the News

Tesla Announces Software Updates To The Model S Via The Internet.

The [Wall Street Journal](#) (3/20, Ramsey, Subscription Publication) reports that that Tesla CEO Elon Musk said on Thursday that the Model S vehicles’ software will begin to be updated within the next 10 days through the cars’ embedded wireless connections. Musk said that he views the updates like ones made to your phone or laptop, marking a fundamental shift from the way cars have been updated in the past.

[Bloomberg News](#) (3/19, Hull) reports that the new software upgrade will add additional “trip-planning, safety and connectivity features,” while another upgrade “in a few months will give the cars the ability to steer themselves on private property at low speeds or on major roads,” Musk said.

FAA Approves Amazon’s Request For Experimental Use Of Drones Outdoors.

The [New York Times](#) (3/19, B2, Wingfield, Subscription Publication) reported that the Federal Aviation Administration has “given Amazon a green light to begin testing drones,” so that it will be allowed to “conduct test flights of its drones outdoors, as long as the company obeys a host of rules like flying below 400 feet and only during daylight hours.” The drones must “be operated by a pilot with a certificate to fly a private manned aircraft.” The company continues to seek “more flexibility” from the FAA.

The [Wall Street Journal](#) (3/19, B2, Bensinger, Subscription Publication) reported that the company will be able to test its plans more readily than it could indoors.

The [AP](#) (3/19) reported that the aircraft has to “remain within the line of sight of the pilot and observer.”

Roads and Highways

Lowenthal Introduced Bill To Repair National Freight Infrastructure.

The [RealEstateRama](#) (3/19) reports that Rep. Alan Lowenthal (D-CA) introduced the bipartisan National Multimodal and Sustainable Freight Infrastructure Act, which would “raise roughly \$8 billion a year dedicated to freight-related infrastructure projects throughout the nation.” The article details the act, which would create a Freight Transportation Infrastructure Trust Fund to “be funded through a national 1 percent waybill fee on the transportation cost of goods.”

FHWA: 1,837 Louisiana Bridges Deemed Structurally Deficient.

The [Shreveport \(LA\) Times](#) (3/19, Burris) reports that according to the FHWA, there are “1,837 structurally deficient bridges in Louisiana.” Citing the FHWA, the article notes that most of the bridges in the state that are considered structurally deficient are “state or parish-owned.”

Energy

Sea Power Viewed As Having Significant Potential.

[Bloomberg View](#) (3/20, Gilbert) reports that relative to other renewable energy sources, tidal power is “scandalously underutilized.” Marine power companies raised just \$74 million last year which was twice the total for the previous year, but down from a high of \$271 million in 2007. The UK is “ideally suited to water technology...and rich enough to fund investments” but even with more experimental sites than the rest of the world it produces the tidal power equivalent of a single wind turbine. Australia and Scotland offer “encouraging signs” and “plans are underway to build the world’s first tidal-lagoon power plant” in Wales with additional schemes being designed the sum of which could supply eight percent of the UK’s needs.

FERC: Fuel Prices Lower And Less Volatile This Winter.

[Platts](#) (3/20, McMahon) reports that Federal Energy Regulatory Commission officials said that lower power and natural gas prices this winter in the US are a “stark comparison” to last year. FERC officials attribute the low winter prices to regulatory reforms, improved infrastructure, natural gas inventories, improved coordination between electricity and natural gas producers. Ryan Stertz of FERC did note however that “significant production out of the Marcellus Shale overwhelms infrastructure” and that the export of natural gas will moderate prices in coming years. James Burchill of FERC said that less price volatility reduced speculative trading profits which prompted large banks to lower their financial exposure to petroleum markets.

NTSB Issues Recommendations For Gas Pipeline Industry.

[Fierce Energy](#) (3/20, Lundin) reports that as a result of a study the NTSB conducted on “integrity management of gas transmission pipelines in urban areas,” the agency issued 28 recommendations for the gas pipeline industry. The article says that the recommendations are aimed at expanding and improving “guidance on the application of the integrity management practices” across the nation for regulators and gas operators. Fierce Energy also notes that Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) said that the utility has “already completed” or is “in the process of completing” several of the recommendations.

Meanwhile, [Pipeline and Gas Journal](#) (3/20, Tubb) says the NTSB study recommends significant changes to integrity management programs of “gas transmission pipelines in high-consequence areas (HCAs).” The article notes that the study’s findings indicate that the PHMSA’s requirements of integrity management programs “have kept the rate of corrosion and material failures of pipe or welds low.” However, the study also found that there is no evidence that instances of gas transmission pipeline incidents in HCA pipelines have declined overall.

Obama Administration To Issue Federal Fracking Regulations On Friday.

The [Wall Street Journal](#) (3/20, Harder, Subscription Publication) reports that the Obama Administration will issue new regulations aimed at creating a national standard for hydraulic fracturing on Friday. According to Interior Secretary Sally Jewell in a speech on Tuesday, the rules will set standards for the construction of wells and wastewater disposal, and require companies to disclose the chemicals they use. A government proposal from May 2013 estimated that the rules will cost the oil and gas industry between \$12 and \$20 million a year. In

anticipation of the new regulations, Sen. James Inhofe (R-OK), chairman of the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee, introduced legislation on Thursday to prohibit Federal regulation of fracking and instead give regulatory responsibility to states. According to the article, the bill has support from all Senate Republicans, but is not expected to become law.

Environmental Concerns A Top Priority Two Weeks After Illinois Derailment.

[KCRG-TV](#) Cedar Rapids, IA (3/20, Wiedemann) reports online that environmental concerns continue to be a "top priority" for BNSF representatives and Federal officials two weeks after the crude oil train derailment in Galena, Illinois. Later, the article also notes that energy industry leaders have recently taken issue with claims made by the FRA "about whether transportation or energy companies are responsible for preventing" oil train accidents. In a letter to Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx, Charles Drevna, the president of the American Fuel & Petrochemical Manufacturers, called for "addressing track integrity and human factors."

Hi Mike,

Just wanted to touch base and let you know that things are proceeding with the Microgrid Pilot planning with Duke Energy and USFSP, though not at the pace we would like. Duke is, of course, resistant to change, but we are working to show them that a new financial model can be developed in the course of this pilot to ensure they will have a rate structure that will adequately compensate them in a distributive power system. Right now, Duke is sending a Sustainability Manager to the meetings (Tom Lowery) who is tasked with expanding Solar and does not have the expertise required in Microgrid. It appears that individual is located in Charlotte at their Corporate Office. We are working to get a conference call with him to move things forward more effectively. Thank you for sending Marty Sorrentiono, who is contributing well to the process.

Microgrid pilots are up and running around the nation in a few cities, and the financial model is similar to that used to finance streetlights. We have 3rd party financing in place through the microgrid technology providers, so there is no upfront cost to the city, USFSP, or other customers. California, Maryland and Vermont have some of the examples we can use to support the process.

In the last meeting, we discussed piloting the Microgrid project in the Innovation District downtown -- incorporating hospitals, university and research (SRI, Poynter). This involves various multipurpose developments, critical needs facilities, and includes housing (Univ dorms), so it is a good model. We are then overlaying it with an Eco District which includes that area, municipal facilities downtown, and expands on down through Edge, Grand Central and Dome Districts, to include Tropicana and the Police Station area. This will incorporate major power users who can pilot recapture of energy in closed-loop engineered systems for waste-to-energy, in addition to microgrid.

This innovative energy and economic development planning, when properly marketed, will place St Petersburg on the forefront of green and eco-smart cities, working with smart grid systems for redundancy that makes the city more Resilient. Such planning and development will support the city's proposal for Rockefeller Foundation funding (\$1,000,000) including hiring a Chief Resiliency Officer. This would fund expansion of infrastructure improvements and Eco District planning for replacing aging housing stock and addressing extensive poverty, crime and unemployment issues in Childs Park, for example, addressing available properties which Mike Dove is working on with his Blue Dot Map.

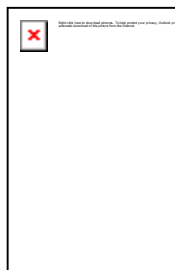
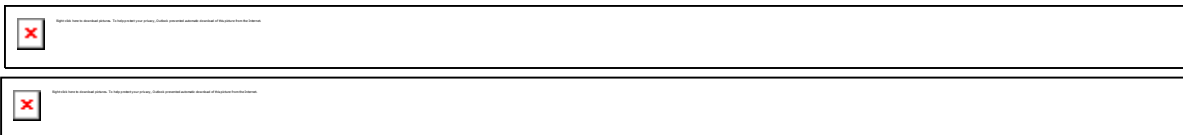
